We are thrilled to announce that we have been selected to benefit from a UK Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO) Small Charities Challenge Fund (SCCF) project grant through UK Aid Direct.

SCCF grants are awarded to UK-registered, grassroots charities to fund projects that are working to address the 17 Global Goals (Sustainable Development Goals) agreed by World Leaders in 2015.

The UK Aid Community Health Programme aims to improve the lives of the most vulnerable and marginalised by increasing immunisation coverage & health education - and improving maternal care in Bukasakya sub-county, Uganda. It's funded by UK aid from the British people.

Some examples of the Community Health Programme in action:

- 30 new Community Health Promoters (CHPs) have started training and will join our existing team of 180 CHPs to make a total of 210 CHPs active in the community. The new CHPs will reach out to 2 new areas to enhance our community outreach work.
- All existing 180 CHPs will receive up-skilling training over the 2 year programme; with 30 having already started their up-skilling training in Maternal Health.
- SoA-UF staff and volunteers received safeguarding training and were awarded a certificate (shown by Beatrice below).
- Data collection has been enhanced. And Harriet, amongst others, progressed from a certificate in General Records Management to Medical Records Management.
